

Go and Bear Fruit

Fruit trees are one of the many wonders of God's creation. To see the beauty of the tree and its fruit, to enjoy its taste, and to realize that it all came from a tiny seed is beyond our comprehension. An apple seed is planted in the ground, and, with water and sun as nourishment, miraculously a seedling surfaces that develops into a fruit tree. After a period of time, the apple tree fulfills its mission by bearing apples.



We, as Christians, are like that apple tree. We, too, have been fed and nourished by God so we can bear fruit. "You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide..." (John 15:16). Jesus tells us "I am the Vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in Me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). The life and power of any plant is found in its vine. The vine uses the branches to produce its fruit. The branch is simply a growth of the vine, produced by it and appointed to bear fruit. The branch exists only because the vine makes it possible.

Fruit characterizes the life of the Christian steward. When we stay connected to Jesus, we are told that we "will bear much fruit." Christ has given us the task of ministering to the needs of others and spreading the Gospel. As we stay connected to Him through His Word and Sacraments, we discover God's perfect will for us, and we are empowered to please Him by bearing fruit (Colossians 1:9-10). God has created us to bear fruit (Ephesians 2:10), but only through Christ is it possible for us to do so.

"If we live by the Spirit," Paul exhorted, "let us also keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking one another, envying one another" (Galatians 5:25-26). As children of God, we have this fruit because His Spirit lives in us, not as a result of our own efforts. We do cease to bear fruit when we give in to our sinful natures, becoming, in Paul's words, "Conceited, provoking one another." We are to "Have nothing to do with the fruitless deeds of darkness" (Ephesians 5:11a), but are to "Walk as children of light (for the fruit of light is found in all that is good and right and true), and try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord" (Ephesians 5:8b-10).

Go and bear fruit!

While walking in the exhibit hall we were able to have a few minutes rest on the pink sofa at The Lutheran Ladies Lounge / KFUO Christian radio booth. Shortly after that, we had to go to the Michigan District caucus meeting. Followed by the Opening Divine Service with Holy Communion at 7:00 PM with over 4000 people attending. All those voices singing and praising God together was so awesome and inspiring.

The second day opened with the procession of District Flags. Then onto Bible Study and the third business session. We voted on bylaw changes and updates. We heard budget reports including the update on the Mission Grant Budget, which now is set at \$2.6 million. We learned which grants were selected to be supported by the LWML in the 2025-2027 biennium. We heard the keynote speaker Rev Kris Whitney as well as Mites in Action speakers. Then in the evening, we attended a Bible study with our "favorite" author, Donna Snow. If you participated in the Bible study we did here at Trinity on the Book of Esther, she was the author of that study. It was a great day!



Mites are collected the first Sunday of the month. A box will be in the back of the church. Contributions will be sent to the district LWML/ Districts retain 75% of the mite offering to fund district mission grants and 25% is sent to the national LWML to fund national mission grants.








VL Signing Day
